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### Teaching and Learning in Healthcare Glossary

#### A

**Active Learning:** A teaching method that requires students to engage in activities such as discussions, problem-solving, or simulations to promote learning through hands-on experience.

**Assessment:** The process of evaluating a learner's knowledge, skills, and attitudes to determine their level of understanding and progress.

#### B

**Blended Learning:** A combination of traditional face-to-face instruction and online learning to enhance the learning experience and provide flexibility to learners.
